Virtues and the Beatitudes.Hear

The Beatitudes from the Sermon on the Mount (Matt 5:1-12)

Jesus summarises the law (the great commandment) (Matt 22:36-40, Lk 10:27)

Believe

The Beatitudes show the loving face of Christ.

The Beatitudes describe how faithful Christians should aim to live their lives.

Celebrate

A petition is a form of prayer. The Our Father is the perfect prayer given to us by Jesus.

The theological virtues help Christians follow Jesus' great commandment.

Live

That the virtues of faith, hope and love help Christians to live out the Beatitudes.

Maths

Multiplication and Division

Multiply numbers, progressing gradually until multiplying 4 digits two digits.

Short division, division with remainders, dividing a four digit by a one digit number and effective division.

Problem solving using division and multiplication.

Fractions

Multiplying unit fractions by integers (whole numbers) then progressing to non-unit fractions by integers and mixed numbers by integers.

Fractions of amounts and fractions as operators.

Exploring how and why different materials used for different things.

Learning which method works best for separating different materials- evaporation, sieving or magnetic etc.

Delving into magnetism with practical learning and understanding how magnetism relates to the world around us.
