Toolkit: Setting

- Choose a name that suggests something about the setting- *Hangman's Wood*
- Select the time of day and weather to create a desired effect- *thunder rumbled through the darkness.*
- Bring the setting to life using carefully chosen verbs and adverbs- *Snow fell gently and covered the cottage in the wood.*
- Step into the setting and bring it to life using the senses, e.g. a detailed sentence of 3 to describe what can be seen, heard or touched- *Old carpets, dusty sheets and broken chairs littered the floor.*
- Bring the setting to life through personification- *The warm night air caressed her face.*
- Show the setting through the character's eyes- *Jo looked round the room.*

Place Value

Recognise the place value of each digit in a 4-digit number (thousands, hundreds, tens and ones).

Find 1,000 more or 1,000 less than a given number.

Read and write numbers up to 10,000 in numerals and words.

Order and compare numbers beyond 1,000.

Identify, represent and estimate numbers using a range of representations, including number lines and place value charts.

Round any number to the nearest 10, 100 or 1,000.

Solve number and practical problems involving the above place value skills.

Partition 4-digit numbers into thousands, hundreds, tens and ones.
